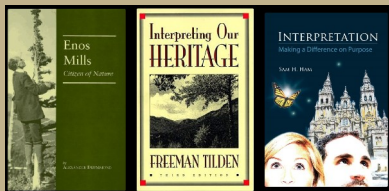


Types and Places for Interpretive Planning

Interpretive Planning often involves a single institution like a museum, arboretum, botanic garden, park, and visitor center however interpretive planning can also assist larger regional communities such as historic and scenic byways, multi-site museum/park systems etc. Effective planning can then integrate exhibits, media, and programs into effective Master Plans. Visitor experiences can also focus on just one site or collection.

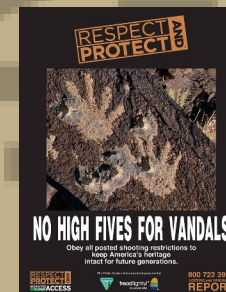
